

## PROGRAM REGISTRATION INFORMATION

### RESIDENCY

A resident for registration purposes, (for all programs held at a school district facility) is anyone who lives within the boundaries of the Slinger School District. A resident (for all programs held at Village owned property) is anyone who lives within the boundaries of the Village of Slinger. To qualify as a resident the individual must pay their property taxes to the Village of Slinger. The additional charge per program for non-residents is \$15.00 to \$25.00.

## INSURANCE & LIABILITY

The Slinger Parks & Recreation Department does not provide hospital / medical insurance coverage for people participating in our programs and cannot assume responsibility for any injuries to participants in its recreation programs. All participants are required to complete and sign a liability waiver on the registration form prior to the start of the program.

### REFUND POLICY

**There will be no refunds within 2 weeks of the starting date of any program. All other refunds will be processed after a 50% cancellation charge is deducted. All refunds take a minimum of 2 weeks to process. Exceptions will be made for medical reasons.**
